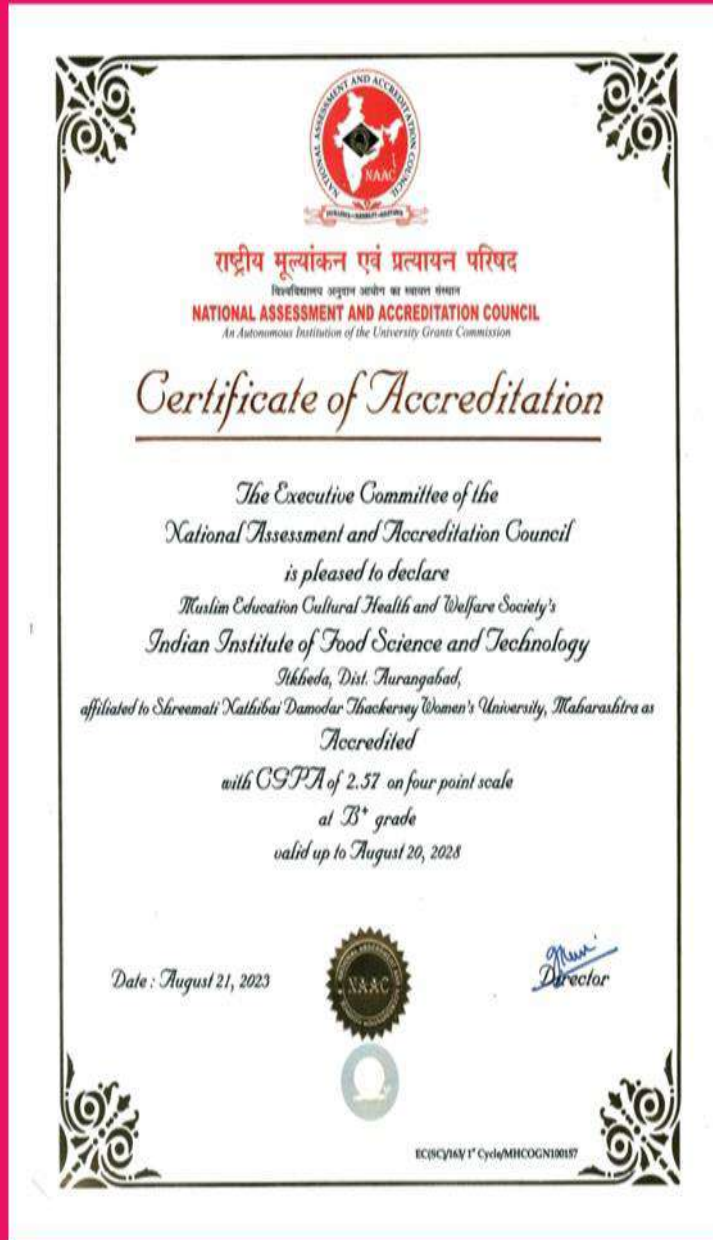

HERE ARE GLIMPSE OF OUR COURSES

- **B.Sc. in Food Science and Quality Control**
